Timber Berths of the Munger Syndicate

Extending From Too Much Gold Far Up the East Fork of the Klondike.

T. D. Greene returned yesterday afternoon from an extensive trip up the Klondike, bronzed and weather-beaten from a continuous exposure of over a month.

Mr. Greene's work on the trip just completed consisted entirely in surveying and mapping the timber berths of the Munger syndicate of which there are several.

The next is a considerable distance above the canyon, beginning at the mouth of the south fork of the Klondike and extending down stream a distance of five miles and a mile in width the same as the first named.

Mr. Greene reported having met a number of people en route to Arizona creek to do their yearly representation.

What has been found on Arizona, if anything, the claim owners in that vicinity preserve the most astounding secrecy, so that as far as the general knowledge of the public is concerned the creek may be worthless or as rich as Eldorado.
