## STICKS BY THE CORPORATIONS.

On Saturday the local "Liberal" organ spent two columns in defending the corporations against Mr. Fraser's assessment attack. The Banner is considerably muddled as to the facts, as usual, but let that pass. The point is that Mr. Fraser seeks to have the municipalities aided by the receipts of a just assessment of railroads and other corporations, while Mr. Pardo's organ attacks him vigorously therefor and seeks to prove that the railroads and other corporations are sufficiently taxed, anyway. The machine and the corporations hang together well, but it is the people who will pass judgment on the 29th. And the verdict will be for Whitney and Fraser and the people's rights, as against corporations and monopolies.

## WHY?

The following is from the Detroit Journal, where recent pro-Boss ardor and slurs at Canada's south African contingents gave evidence of the affectionate interest it takes in this country and its people. The Windsor Record and other Rossite publications are quoting it extensively.

The Journal says:—  
They (the Liberals) have a leader in whom the people have every confidence. Premier Ross is counted the ablest man in Canada, next to Premier Laurier. If anything happened to Premier Laurier, Ross would be his successor. Indeed the Conservatives were the first to mention Ross' name in connection with the Dominion premiership when it was recently reported that Laurier would resign on account of ill-health. Mr. Ross has been premier since the death of Premier Hardy three years ago. He was then Minister of Education and to his superior ability as an educationist is credited the splendid school system that obtains in the province. He is the ablest premier Ontario ever had, although Sir Oliver Mowat, the present Lieutenant-governor of the province, who carried the province at every election for 25 years, was a leader of no mean ability.

To all of which patriotic Canadians are inclined to query.

Why are the interests of the Yankees so identical with the success of Ross?

Is it because Ross so ardently sought the interests of the Michigan lumbermen, until the able Liberal-Conservative chieftain, Mr. Whitney, forced his hand by arousing public sentiment?

## THE MAN THEY COULD NOT BRIBE.

No more convincing arraignment of the Ross Government has been made than that put forward by Mr. J. J. Foy in his speech at Carleton. Mr. Foy takes good care to make a sharp distinction between the comparatively few Liberals who, since they are at the head of affairs, take advantage of their position to enact unrighteousness, and the far greater number who have become more and more dissatisfied with the corrupt bossism and heelership of the party leaders, until now they are prepared to sacrifice party to principle. The broadness of mind which characterizes Mr. Foy's address is one of the traits of the man. As a political factor in Ontario he ranks high, high enough, in the opinion of the Dominion Government, to be offered the highest position on the bench, in the hope of removing him from the political world. Foy was proof. He spurned their offers, and is as ready as ever to denounce them for their misdeeds.

At Carleton he spoke in part as follows:

"However, Mr. Chairman, the Conservative party does not in this election rely solely upon what we call the wickedness of—I won't say the other party—but of the dominating party in the other party. I claim, sir, that there are thousands and thousands of honest Liberals who deprecate what has been done, just as much as the Conservatives do. These facts have been the acts of active supporters of the party in various constituencies. They have been the acts of office holders and office seekers, of men in government pay, and men who have been seeking to get at the purse strings of this country, and I charge that the Government, even if not personally implicated, are really responsible, because they have virtually condoned what these men have done. They have taken the fruits of the work of these men; they are enjoying the fruits of these men, and have done nothing to bring them to justice. We charge that the Government are giving grants to their favorites, and that they are legislating in the interests of corporations and others who make a return to them by assisting them at election time. The feeling of the country must be against that sort of thing, and we have to bring it before the people. I say there are thousands of Liberals who feel that way. We must ask them to give expression to their feelings at the polls in the coming election. (Hear, hear.) Then there is another class of men who force the Government to do things that probably they do not feel inclined to do. I have told you of their giving grants and favors to political favorites, but there are other men who are even more dangerous than favorites. They are men who probably are not favorites with them, but who hold the political pistol to their heads and demand certain things and in default of getting their demand threaten that they will go against the Government. The Government is weak and yields, and that is even a greater danger than merely having a friendly feeling towards some of their friends, and giving them political favors of one kind and another. That is something that I ask honest Liberals to condemn, and to go further than merely condemn with their mouths, condemn with their hands."

deeds by their vote at the ballot. (Applause.)

"Now, Mr. Chairman, going into politics, or representing constituencies or possibly forming a government, is not or ought not to be for the benefit of individuals. It is not for the glory of the individual himself, no matter how high a position he may take in the government. It is not for the personal advancement of any body. It is to administer the affairs of the country well; it is to administer them economically; to find out what wrongs exist, and to pass legislation to remedy these wrongs. Another duty of a government is to be perfectly frank and fair, and above board in their statement to the public as to the financial condition of the country. They should take the public into the confidence of the government; let it know exactly where the country stands as to its assets and liabilities, as to its receipts and disbursements, and give them a frank, full, clear, intelligible and unambiguous statement of the financial condition of the country. Mr. Chairman, I charge the present government with violating all these, which I say are the primary and proper functions of an administrative body, and of a governing body. I say they do not look to see whether a particular measure will benefit the public, but they are surrounded by friends who consult them and whom they consult, and whose interests they follow. They do not administer the affairs of this country economically, they do not administer the affairs economically; they do not pass legislation, simply because they think it may cure a wrong, to remedy some evil, to put something right."

## GOVERNMENT LIBERality.

The government organs are constantly harping on what the Ross administration has done for the people of New Ontario. It has been lavish, at all events, in helping its friends with the property which the whole people own. Conservatives as well as Liberals are interested in what the government has been doing with the property which they own jointly. But below are given some instances of what has been done, for which the Liberal papers have not given them credit. The Mail and Empire supplies the omissions:

The Ross Government has placed a debt of \$5,600,000 upon Ontario and has incurred new railway liabilities aggregating \$7,752,000.

It has given 6,560,000 acres of land, with all their minerals to railway companies, and 15,660 square miles of pulpwood secretly and without public competition, to syndicates.

It has supplemented its revenues by depriving the municipalities of income from licenses and corporations. It has proposed to take 15 per cent. of all the corporation taxes the municipalities now collect; and it has seized authority to levy direct taxes upon every citizen, and to compel the county, city, or town tax gatherer to collect them.

It has locked up land in New Ontario; that the colonist may not occupy it; it has driven 4,617 settlers out of New Ontario in ten years; it has squandered colonization road money upon politicians; it has handicapped the miner with laws that are pronounced "rotten" by experts.

It has refused agricultural schools for the farmer, and has declined to reform the educational system, to mitigate the text-book monopoly, and to modernize the public schools.

It has used the licensing system for politics, levying upon license holders and rejecting moral reform.
