Obituary.

At the homestead, Paradise, Annapolis county, Feb. 27th, aged 85 years, entered into rest Charlotte, daughter of the late W. H. Troop, E. q., at one time a resident of Wolfville, and widow of Avar Longley Esq., who represented the county of Annapolis almost continuously from 1859 to 1881, and was commissioner of railways for Nova Scotia from 1864 to 1869. He was also for a number of years a governor of Acadia College.

Mrs. Longley before her marriage, associated with an older sister, conducted a private school for young ladies in a building, (now removed) on the Ryan's property, east Main street, Wolfville. For fifteen years Mrs. Longley suffered from a bronchial affection, and for the last four years of her life was almost wholly confined to her room, but her intellect was clear until the end, and she ever maintained an intelligent interest in the affairs of her own church and community, and the outside world as well.

The funeral, held at the residence of her eldest son on Monday p. m., March 1st, was largely attended. Comforting words were spoken by Rev. J. D. MacLeod, pastor of the Baptist church, Paradise, Rev. Mr. McNaught, a former pastor, and Rev. Haddon Balcom, a family friend. In the passing of this noble and gifted woman her immediate family, her friends and the community in which she so long resided have sustained a loss, but they cherish the imperishable memory of a beautiful character, and a life devoted to high ideals of Christian service. The deceased is survived by two sons residing in Paradise, and two daughters, Mrs. T. R. Wallace and Miss Longley, now residing in Wolfville.

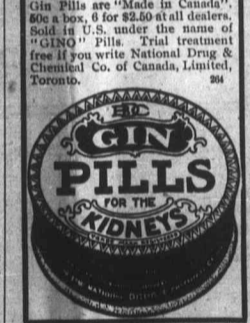

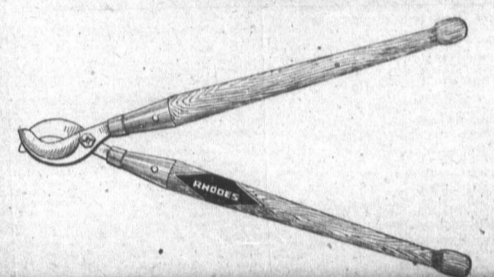
