# IMPORTANT MINERAL DIS-COVERY IN PICTOU COUNTY

(Eastern Chronicle.)

During the past year a mineral discovery was made in Pictou Co. that may mean much to the future of this part of the Province. It was the finding of a seam of Ankerite, which is an iron deposit of much more than ordinary value. The new find was made south of the Lorne Hills and close to the road leading from Lorne to Trafal. road leading from Lorne to Trafalgar. Its immdeiate location is a small lake called Elbow Lake, close to the road and near to the West Branch Lake. The story of the find, we are not familiar with, but the prospecting during the past summer has been carried on by the Nova Scotia Coal Company. The actual work has been in charge of Mr. Lauchlin McLean, who for years was the Company's super-intendent at the Wabana Mines, in Newfoundland. The work on so far has been largely devoted to tracing the extent of the seam, which is said to be a clearly defined one and of good size. In the tests for distance it has answerthe tests for distance it has answered well and has been tapped at several places considerable distances apart. The question now is the extent of the depth. Of this nothing is known. There has been no sinking in the seam. That will no doubt be undertaken in the prince of the seam of the seam. spring. As yet it is merely a surface prospect but at that a very promising one, Very little has been said by those in touch with the situation, as no doubt they wished to assure themselves in the matter of the depth and extent of the seam before making any pro-nouncement, and when questioned the reply was "as a prospect it looks fairly promising, but remem-ber it is nothing as yet, but a pro-spect." So that may be taken as cautiously summing up the situ-
