Warren G. Harding Elected President of United States

New York, Nov. 3-At 12.30 o'clock this morning with actual returns far from complete, Harding was certain of 346 votes in the electoral college rom the following states:

Connecticut, Deleware, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nebraska, New Hamp-shire, New Jersey, New York, Oh.o, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Washington, Wisconsin

and Wyoming.

The states from which returns were too meagre to justify actually placing them in either the Harding or Cox column were: Arizona, 3; California, 13; Colorada, 6; Indiana, 15; Kentucky, 13; Maryland, 8; Minner ota, 12; Missouri, 18; Mortana, 4: Nevada, 3; New Mexico, 3; North Dakota, 5; South Dakota, 5; Utah, 4 and West Virginia 8, a total of 120 The states which were certain for Cox at that hour were:

It is very apparent that by using the trap nest, one gets the individual records of each bird and that, from these, the boarders are easily deteced and only the profitable fowls kept. It may not seem so apparent that the trap nest has an economic value, for at a first glance it would appear that more labour and expense added to the poultry work. A few figures taken from data compiled the Experimental Farm, Nappan, S. during the past ten months, obtained by the trap nesting of one pen of 53 Barred Rocks, also a pen of 53 White Leghorns, will answe

Out of the 53 Rocks, 22.6 per cent Out of the 53 Rocks, 22.0 per cell laid less than 100 eggs in the ten months, their average being 7.14 dozen, which, at the average market value of 50 cents per dozen, would value of 50 cents per dozen, would realize \$3.57. It cost \$2.81 for feed alone, thus leaving a balance of 76 cents. The remaining 77.4 per cent of the birds produced an average of 10.95 dos. per bird, realizing at 50 cents per dozen \$5.48 at the cost of \$2.81 for feed, thus leaving a balance of \$2.67 per bird. Therefore a hundred birds like the former would only

dred birds like the former would only give a profit of \$76.00 over the cost of feed, while 100 like the latter would give a profit of \$267.00

Out of the 53 White Leghorns 37.7 per cent laid the than 100 eggs in the ten months, their average being 6.3 dozen per bird. These valued at 50 cents per dozen, give \$3.15, and deduct cost of feed \$2.81 leaves a balance of \$4 cents per bird. The 62.3 per cent over the 160 egg mark laid an average of 10.8 doz. per bird at 50 cents realized 55.45 less \$2.81 for feed, leaving balance of \$2.54 per bird.
