The council acceded to the request subject to the reservation that the football club had the same option, and that a list of dates should be submitted to the city council.

He appealed to the large audience present, saying that if the citizens were at the back of the system it would be a success and he believed that the result would be a vast improvement upon present conditions. At St. Petersburg, the planet Mars will be on the cusp of the fourth house, prosignifying destructive fires, explosions and outrages. A serious plot against the czar should be guarded against.

At Calcutta the ingress takes place in the fourth house, denoting a danger on seismic troubles and scarcity of provisions. Railways will prosper, but expenditure on armaments will be heavy. ECLIPSE

There will be 2 eclipses in January 1907, that will have great effect in some parts of the world. Eclipse of the sun Jan. 14th was visible in Britain and visible at Madras and Hong Kong.
