TO TAKE A PLEBISCITE OVER PROPOSED BRIDGE

City Council Decides That It Would Be Cheaper Than a Bylaw.

A plebiscite will be taken on the advisability of building a bridge over the Thames to connect South and West London. This was decided upon at the council last night.

The recommendation came from the board of works, Head Engineer Van Tave explaining that he did not think a pier in the centre would do any harm in the way of causing ice jams.

When the recommendation was presented it was moved by Ald. Tancock and Jeffries, that a bylaw be submitted.

"Is there enough traffic to justify us in spending \$40,000 for a bridge," asked Ald. Richter, who advised against it. Ald. Asplund thought the question had not been sufficiently considered, and suggested that it go over to next year's council.

"If it is going to be voted on, it should go in the form of a plebiscite," said Ald. Richter. "A bylaw would cost \$300, possibly \$500, while a plebiscite would cost about \$50. There is no need of expending the larger sum on a proposition that is certain not to carry."

"A bylaw would be better," declared Ald. Tancock. "Still Ald. Richter would block it on its second reading. What are you going to do?"

"Never mind what I will do," shot back Ald. Richter.

The motion to submit a plebiscite then carried.

NIAGARA POWER FOR THE FARM AND HAMLET

Mr. Beck Proposes Big Things to Session of County Council.

Niagara power for every farm and every hamlet in this section was a prophecy made by Hon. Adam Beck to the county council in session here yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Beck attended presumably to talk over a grant to the Sanatorium, but soon drifted into a discussion of Niagara power, and for half an hour or more he spoke on that subject.

"Niagara power will be supplied to every farmer or village or hamlet that wants it," said Mr. Beck. "It will be given at cost, and there is no reason why all of you and your neighbors should not avail themselves of this privilege."

He declared that many labor-saving devices could use power—the churn, the washing machine, the choppers, the separators, the fanning mills. Electric light would do away with the old coal oil lantern, with its many dangers, and would enable the farmer to proceed with perfect safety through his stables and barns.

Low Tension Wires. In every circuit there would be low tension wires, coming back to the sub-station, and these could be tapped for energy.

There would be centres in a score of localities, and these low tension wires would carry power for 30 miles in any direction. Mr. Beck states that the energy could be radiated from London, St. Thomas, St. Marys, Stratford, Woodstock and elsewhere.

"In a few short years the Province and particularly this section, will be covered with a network of radials," declared Mr. Beck. "They will be using Niagara power, and they will be compelled to sell to farmers and municipalities along the road all the power they need at a price to be fixed by the Hydro-Electric Commission. The people will be preserved, and the people will be preserved, and there will be no possibility of a hold-up in the price of power."

The Government will merely act as the financial agent of the people. We will erect these low tension lines, as we have the others. The people will pay off the indebtedness in annual charges, which will include interest and sufficient sinking
