# FOE LOSES MORE GROUND IN RUMANIAN CAMPAIGN

### WITH DOUBTFULS STILL WILSON'S LEAD 8.

## With Five To Hear From BELGIANS TORN Wilson Leads Hughes by Margin of Eight Votes All Able-Bodied Men Forced

Sensation of Day in Presidential Contest Is Switch of New Hampshire To Democratic Column-Managers of Both Sides Continue To Claim Victory On Count of Doubtful States To Be Heard From.

New York, Nov. 9 .- If the result of the incomplete returns of Tuesday's balloting are accepted as final in all but five states, at noon today, the electoral vote would give President Wilson 251 and Mr. Hughes

The five doubtful states, with their electoral votes, are: California, 13; Minnesota, 12; New Mexico, 3; North Dakota, 5, and New Hampshire, 4.

#### NEW HAMPSHIRE'S SWITCH.

The sudden switch of New Hampshire from a small Hughes plurality to 93 votes for Wilson was the dramatic change in the situation this forenoon. It came in an announcement from the secretary of state that a partial official count of all the districts disclosed errors in tabulation by town and ward clerks to that extent. The official count is progressing.

In Minnesota and New Mexico the incomplete returns show Mr. Hughes to have the lead, while in California and North Dakota Mr. Wilson is leading.

The returns from the doubtful Western States are belated and are not expected to be available before a late hour today.
