WAVE IS NOW PASSING

Ontario Temperatures Show a Downward Tendency.

Cooler Weather is Promised For the End of the Week and Thunderstorms Are in Sight — Death List Grows—London, Ont., Registers 101 Degrees—Two Dead From Heat In Toronto and Two In Hamilton.

Toronto, July 5.—The climax has been reached. That is the best piece of encouragement to be had out of the heat wave story yesterday. But that does not mean either that the mercury is down, or that the heat will go down. The latest reports from the meteorological office indicate that the long-suffering people of this province must put up with close attention from the sun until the end of the week.

The highest point registered by official thermometers in Toronto yesterday was 97, between noon and one o'clock.

London, Ont., was highest in Ontario with 101. Montreal showed 94, Quebec 88, and Ottawa 86.

The weather man is inclined to be pessimistic, and he will not commit himself to promise any material change for several days. The intelligence of the hot blast is passing over the border, and some consolation, anyway for Canadians, along with the fact that the wind—or what was said to be the wind—shifted from south to west, bringing a promise of thunderstorms. Storms were general in Quebec and the eastern provinces.

Two Deaths In Hamilton.
Hamilton, July 5.—J. F. Hogan, 28 years old, the second victim of the present hot weather, died at the city hospital at 5:30 yesterday afternoon. He was overcome early yesterday afternoon at the C.P.R. construction camp west of the high level bridge, where he was employed as crane man on the steam shovel.

Naamane Woman Dead.
Kingston, July 5.—It was very warm yesterday, but it was not as bad as Monday. At 8 a.m. the thermometer was 71 in the shade. It is claimed Kingston is the coolest place in the province during the summer. At 3 p.m. the highest point reached was 82.6. At Naamane Mrs. John Williams dropped dead from the effects of the heat. It was one hundred degrees there Monday.

Heat Was Fatal.
Windsor, July 5.—Thomas Kenny, foreman for the S. W. & A. Street Railway, died early yesterday morning of a paralytic stroke brought on by heat. He worked as usual Monday, but became prostrated late on Monday night.

Refused to Return Money.
St. Catharines, July 5.—Kirkar Varatnam and Abdul Khayyat were arrested Monday night, charged with fraudulently obtaining by certain money entrusted to them as officers of the Educational Society.

A Border Outrage.
St. Catharines, July 5.—Miss A. D. Parry, one of the best-known residents of Dunnville, Haldimand County, who on her way to Buffalo to see her cousin, of whose serious illness she was possibly fatal illness she had been apprised.

In spite of the fact that she had a retainer, she was taken off the train at Black Rock, put through a severe cross-examination, and although vouched for by M. L. Parry, J. W. Gray, former G.T.R. agent here, and others, she was sent back to this side.

Crab Shooters Caught.
Chatham, July 5.—D. Johnston, Frank Hurst, Oliver Henson, Lewis Arnold, John Lewis, Harry Barnes, Jacob Harris and Daniel Harris, all residents of Dunnville, were charged in the Police Court on Friday, charged with gambling with dice on Sunday morning. The young men were caught shooting crab in a discarded railway coach on the Pelee Marquette siding in the east end by Officer Tom Groves.

Boy Dies of Lockjaw.
St. Catharines, July 5.—Aaron, the 13-year-old son of Mrs. Joseph Thomas of Contra street, passed away yesterday after two days' illness with tetanus. A week ago Sunday, the little fellow ran a silver in his foot, but no trouble was experienced until Saturday, when the dread disease struck him. All the efforts of the doctor to save his life were in vain.

Spent Bullet Near Taft.
Indianapolis, Ind., July 5.—Before President Taft took his seat in the reviewing stand in front of the Soldiers' Monument here yesterday, what is believed by the police to be a spent bullet struck Mrs. Harry J. Tutewiler, who was sitting near the President's box. The bullet came from a .38-calibre revolver. Mrs. Tutewiler was not seriously injured.

Keywest Aground.
Kingston, July 5.—The steamer Keywest, coal laden, on headway to Montreal, ran aground above Cardinal, in the canal. The steamer Donnelly was summoned from Kingston.
