The H. B. Co.'s steamer Labouche, Capt. Lewis, returned on Tuesday from a trading voyage on the north-west coast of British Columbia, having made the run from Fort Rupert in the short space of 26 hours. She had on board as passengers Mrs. Ogilvy and family, and Mr. Smith, from Bella Coola, Mrs. Horne and family, from Fort Simpson, and a few Indians. Her cargo consisted of a valuable lot of furs, skins, and dog fish-oil. Capt. Lewis stated that he went up north of Sitka, and was tolerably successful in his trading operations with the Indians.

At 5 p.m. passed the schooner Goldstream and Langley beating down; about 11 p.m. saw what we supposed to be the camp fire of Mr. Moss at Salmo river, stopped and blew the whistle with the intention of taking him on board, but receiving no answer, proceeded on. Passed Nanaimo at 11 a.m. on the 23rd. The captain of the Langley and Mr. Moss reported to the captain at Fort Rupert that they had neither seen nor heard anything of the murderer of Mr. Ogilvy on the way down, but it is probable that he has not died from starvation and cold he has got among the Indians at Meekow, as he has been there before and is acquainted with them. He left the schooner without arms, blankets or food.
