

Potatoes are still worth 70c by single bag, and apples \$2 to \$2.75 per barrel. The fish market is unchanged from yesterday with fair demand and no new varieties coming forward. Carrots bring 40c per bag; cabbages 50c to 70c per dozen. Other vegetables in ample supply at unaltered prices.






