As already stated, there is no desire to make proselytes; but (to use the Archbishop's words) 'to encourage Croup tions. them in bettering their religious condition, and to strengthen an ancient Church which, through ignorance within and persecution from without, cannot any longer stand alone, but without some assistance must eventually succurab, though unwillingly, to the exter-nal organizations at work in its midst.' The Missionaries assert that the Metropolitan, at least, does not hold the heresy for which

his Church was excommunicated,
