All arrangements of articles and decorating must be in conformity with the general plan adopted by the Director-General.

The Canadian Commission will take procautions for the safe preservation of all objects in the Exhibition, and it will be responsible for damage or loss of any kind, or for accidents by fire or otherwise.

The Ganadian Commission will employ watchmen of their own choice to guard their goods during the hours the Exhibition is open to the public.
