Corn.—Prices remain nominal at 50c to 51c in bond and 58c to 59c duty paid.

Peas.—There is very little change in this market, and quotations range from 74c to 75c in store. In the Stratford district sales have been made at 57c and 57jc f.o.b., with 58c now asked.

Oats.—Sales of No. 2 have been made at 320 to 321c per 34 lbs, with more offering at the outside figure.
