ECONOMIC COUNCIL OF CANADA

PROVISION FOR ESTABLISHMENT AND DEFINITION OF DUTIES

Right Hon. L. B. Pearson (Prime Minister) moved the third reading of Bill No. C-72, to provide for the establishment of an economic council of Canada.

Hon. Michael Starr (Ontario): I made a reservation with respect to this when I spoke on clause 22. It had to do with the elimination of the national productivity council. I do not intend to go over what I said at that time, it is on record in *Hansard*. But in view of my feeling on this matter and, I know, the feeling of many members of this house, I wish to move, seconded by my hon. friend from Winnipeg South Centre (Mr. Churchill):

That the said bill be not now read a third time but that it be referred to the committee of the whole house with the instruction that they have power to amend it by eliminating therefrom clauses 22 and 11, the objective being to continue the national productivity council.
