I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter in connection with the Rockefeller Foundation.

In reply to same would say, that your letter was placed before the Board of Management of The Montreal General Hospital on Mar. 10th, and after due consideration, it was decided, that in view of the lack of detail the Board of Management do not feel at liberty to commit themselves to any plan until more detail and definite plans are submitted.

They will be discussed fully and fairly, and I am instructed to state by my Board, that the Montreal General Hospital is willing and anxious to cooperate in any plan that will further medical education, and, in particular, the interests of McGill University.
