engaged in the North American Districts are, by the succours of his Holy Spirit, rendered eminently successful.

There are seventeen Missionaries engaged in Eastern Canada; and although they have, in common with their brethren in other parts of the globe, to endure trials and contend with adversaries, they are cheered by repeated manifestations of the divine favour. In Montreal, the principal station, two new chapels, large and beautiful, and capable of accommodating between three and four thousand persons, are now completed. The want of more commodious places of worship is painfully experienced in other Circuits; God is indeed, in this District, enlarging the borders of Sion, and multiplying her converts.
