

least one nurse on duty at all times. They shall render a willing obedience to all the orders of the attending Medical Officer.

41. No male servant shall be permitted to enter a ward when the same is occupied by a female patient, except under the instructions of the Matron.

42. A night and day report of the cases under treatment shall be kept by the nurse in charge.

43. All nursing and administering of medicine shall be done by the nurses.

44. Each nurse shall be under the control of and responsible to the Medical Officer in charge.

REGULATIONS FOR PATIENTS.

45. Every person desiring admission to the Hospital must make application either to his physician, who shall satisfy the Medical Officer that such a person is properly admissable, or to the Medical Officer in charge, who shall examine the applicant and decide whether to admit the same as a patient. Should the Medical Officer find any applicant not a proper case for treatment in the Hospital he may refuse to admit same.

46. In case of accident requiring immediate treatment patients may be admitted by any officer of the institution then present, whose action however shall be subject to the approval of the Medical Officer.

47. No patient shall be admitted whose case is judged to be incurable (unless there be urgent symptoms which in the opinion of the Medical Officer are capable of being relieved), nor any whose case does not require the particular benefits of the institution.

48. All patients shall be admitted as pay patients and shall be charged and liable to pay at the rate of fifteen dollars (\$15) per week for board, nursing, and druggist's supplies, if treated in a private ward,
