

Des Moines, Iowa, Sept. 1.—The threatened miners' strike in this district culminated to-day, and all miners, except about 200 employed in Christy Flnnt Valley and Des Moines Coal and Mining Company's mines, went out, foilowing the lead of the Carbondale miners of several days ago.
