Adelaide, Australia, Jan. 14.—(C.A.P.)—The third test match between the visiting English cricket team and an eleven representing all Australia began here this morning, and at the close of play the home team had scored 313 for seven wickets. The feature of the day's play was a brilliant inning by Collins of Australia for 162.

Collins took place in dull weather, and the Australian team again in the fore, and, as in the other two tests, the English batsmen were expected to bat first. Collins and Bardsley led the batting to the bowling of Howell and Douglas for 100 and 100 respectively. The bowling was good, the English batsmen were not out, and Bardsley was well-timed.
