On Tuesday Evening from Canada, Fredericton, St John, Dorchester, Cumberland and Truro.

On Friday Evening from the United States, New-Brunswick, Annapolis, Kentville, Wolfville, Windsor, Shelburne, Yarmouth, and Digby, and from Parrshoro', during the Summer.

On Saturday Evening from Gay's River, Musquodoboit, Truro, Pictou, Prince Edward Island, Cumberland, Antigonish, Guysborough, Cape Breton, New Brunswick, the Canadas, and the United States, and from Parrshoro', during the winter.

STAGE COACHES, &c.---The Western Stage Coaches, (carrying H. M. Mails,) leave Halifax for Windsor, every morning, Sundays excepted,---for Annapolis on Tuesday and Saturday mornings,---and for Kentville on Thursday morning.---Leave Windsor for Halifax every morning Sunday excepted. Leave Annapolis for Kentville, Windsor and Halifax, on Tuesday and Thursday mornings.

The Eastern Stage Coaches (carrying H. M. Mails,) run three times in the week from Halifax to Pictou, and *vice versa*. Leave Halifax and Pictou, on Monday Wednesday and Friday mornings.

A Stage Coach runs between Amherst, (County of Cumberland,) and St. John, N. B.

The Parrshoro' Packet runs to Windsor and Horton every week, from the 1st of April till Christmas; leaves Parrshoro' for Windsoa, on Monday, from thence for Parrshoro' on Tuesday, immediately after the arrival of the Royal Western Mail Coach; leaves Parrshoro' on Thursday, for Horton, and from thence for Parrshoro' the first high water at or after 8 o'clock on Friday morning. *Passengers who wish to cross from Parrshoro'* should be at PATRIDGE ISLAND the evening previous to the Packet's sailing.

STEAMERS.—A Steam Boat runs from St. John, N. B. to Annapolis, and *vice versa*, TWICE IN THE WEEK, touching at Digby.

A Steam Boat leaves St. John, N. B. on Tuesday for Windsor. Leaves Windsor on her return on Wednesday.

A Steam Boat, leaves Pictou, on Friday morning at 6 o'clock, for Charlotte Town, P. E. I. and Miramichi; and returns to Pictou, calling at Charlotte Town, on Thursday evening.

The foregoing Stage Coach and Steam Boat arrangements are those of the Summer of 1839. Some alterations always take place during the winter.
