**Provincial Belgian Committee.**

A meeting of the provincial Belgian relief committee, attended by Richard O'Leary of Richmond, Dr. C. A. Allan of Fredericton, Irving R. Todd of Milltown, Mayor Frink, James Gilchrist and G. E. Barbour, the city, was held yesterday afternoon. The reports presented showed that since March 1 the people of the province have been contributing at the rate of \$100 a day. The committee discussed the best method of employing the funds, but did not decide whether to forward the cash or a shipment of goods.
