CLAIMS REWARD
FOR ARREST OF
THE FIREBUG

F. C. Gates Application Not Ap-
proved by City Commissioners
—Weekly Meeting of Council

The first claim for the reward offered by the city commissioners for the apprehension and conviction of the person responsible for the epidemic of fires, which was prevalent in the North End of the city several months ago was made to the commissioners at the meeting yesterday afternoon by F. C. Gates. In his letter Mr. Gates pointed out that on information supplied by him the supposed firebug was arrested and he thought because he had been placed in the home for the treatment of nervous diseases was no reason why the reward should not be paid over.

Commissioner McEllen said that the notice offering the reward clearly stated that it would be paid for information causing the arrest and conviction of the guilty party. A man had been arrested but he had been placed temporarily in the asylum until it could be known if he was really insane. The communication was referred to the commissioner of public safety.

Lillian J. M. Deinstadt, secretary of the Girls' Association, sent in a letter requesting aid from the city for carrying on the work of the association during the last two years, and especially the fact that a deaconess had been secured to meet all incoming trains and direct girls to suitable boarding houses and places of employment. It is now proposed to open an employment bureau and communicate with girls in all parts of the maritime provinces who wish to come here to work five hundred dollars would be necessary for this work and it was hoped that the commissioners would help with a special grant. The expenses of the club now amount to nearly \$1,000 a year and it is proposed to broaden the work. The letter was referred to Mayor Frank and it will likely be discussed by the commissioners in committee. Other matters of a routine nature were dealt with.

The petition of ratepayers asking that the by-law limiting the erection of wooden buildings to two stories be repealed was read.

The common clerk was asked to check off the names in order to find whether or not there were the required number of signatures to call for the referendum on the by-law. If the number of names is sufficient a vote will likely be taken. The commissioner of finance and public affairs was instructed to make the necessary aid for the common clerk in checking over the names.

Mayor Frank said that the city intended doing much advertising there should have been an appropriation for the same. A request from the City of Country Life that the city take space in a special Maritime Province number was referred to him.

S. T. C. Knowles applied on behalf of Miss Anna Sullivan, his client, for a renewal of a lease of lot 402 Queen Street and was referred to the commissioner of public lands.

DEMONSTRATION FOR

Still Talks of Emergency—Threatens
Existence of Senate Unless Naval
Bill is Passed

Toronto, May 19.—Prime Minister Borden received an enthusiastic welcome in Toronto tonight and 10,000 people packed the arena. He was accompanied by Hon. J. D. Premier Borden traced the history of the Conservative party's attitude toward the participation of Canada in naval defense, and said that it was the manifest duty of the government to render immediate and effective aid toward the motherland. Mr. Churchill that any action on the part of Canada to widen the margin of our common safety would be significant of the united strength of the empire.

The premier in dealing with Sir Wilfrid's attitude contended that the latter had not met the government's proposals by any desire of aiding in settling a question of urgent interest. Sir Wilfrid's naval proposals were undisputedly of a separatist tendency. The opposition was hostile to the naval bill would meet short shrift in the senate, but he deprecated the insinuation. The senators would not be pulled about when Sir Wilfrid desired it. They were able, intelligent men for the most part, old statesmen of high character, and were they unworthily controlled as had been suggested, he would be prepared to declare that the Canadian Senate had outlived its usefulness.

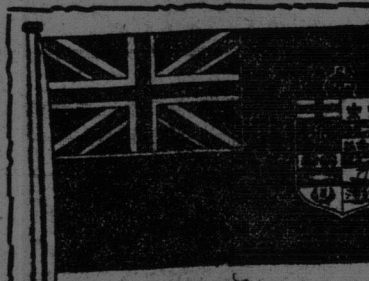
