At St. Martins, Captain Robert Carson is building for the government a crib-work wharf having a face length of 290 feet with sand and gravel filling and will be completed next month.

A wharf at Albert with cribwork pier head 40 by 60 feet and stone and gravel aproach is being built by Contractor William F. Wilson and is nearing completion.

The first three jobs were undertaken for the benefit of the fishermen and the latter two for general shipping.
