DEFENDER OF KUT IS DEAD IN PARIS

Paris, May 18—Major-General Sir Charles B. Townshend, famous as the defender of Kut-el-Amara when he was commander of the British forces in Mesopotamia during the world war, died here today after six months' illness. He was on a visit to his mother-in-law, Countess Cachen d'Anvers at the time of his death.

Major-General Townshend was born in 1861. He entered the Royal Marines in 1881 and saw extensive military service in Egypt, India and South Africa.

Is Given Command.

At the outbreak of the world war, he was given command of the British forces in the attempt to take Bagdad from the Turks. After a few initial successes the Turks, who greatly outnumbered the British, drove back General Townshend's forces to Kut-el-Amara. The British suffering heavy losses in their retreat. From December 1915 to April, 1916 the British gallantly held Kut-el-Amara, but finally were compelled to surrender.

During the siege British aviators several times flew over Kut-el-Amara and dropped food to the starving troops inside. General Townshend declared afterwards that Kut-el-Amara never was captured by the Turks, that the town fell after 145 days of siege of starvation and physical hardships which were indescribable.

The Turkish commander permitted General Townshend to retain his sword when the town fell. The British official report at the time of the capitulation announced that the British force numbered 8,700 men. General Townshend was released by the Turks when Turkey signed the Armistice on October 30, 1918.

Exports From Vancouver Gain

Vancouver, May 19—According to figures compiled by the Vancouver Harbor Commissioners exports from this port for the first three months of the year are already within 80 per cent. of the total for the whole of 1923, and exceed the amount shipped in either 1922 or 1921. The figures are: 1924, Three months, 816,920 tons. 1923, 1,061,113 tons. 1922, 752,045 tons. 1921, 801,000 tons.

Birds Beat Off Attack By Cat

Brighton, Eng., May 19—A large black cat which tried to invade the rookery in the grounds of the Royal Pavilion at Brighton was beaten off by the birds.

As the cat got near the nests in a tall elm tree the whole colony of rooks attacked it.

Taken aback, the cat fell from the branch it was on, but caught at a lower branch. It was again attacked by the birds and finally fell 30 feet to the ground and took refuge in a bush.
