TREE-LIKE GRASSES.

A lawn covered with grass higher
than ordinary lawns is an odd concep-
tion in the United States, but in the
Journal of Heredity, David Fairchild
calls attention to such a growth about
fourteen miles from Savannah. It is a
grove of bamboo, the planting of which
in America has been so often urged.
The species is said to be East Indian, but
the importation is believed to have been
from China or Japan and the first plant-
ing, several miles away, supplied the
first plant for this grove in 1890. The
bamboo grove is unlike any other. The
dense deciduous tropical forests of Java
and Sumatra, the evergreen fir and spruce
forests of Canada, the eucalyptus cov-
ered plains of Australia, the rainy re-
gions of Brazil, the date-palm groves
of Egypt and the fern-forests of
Hawaii are all different from each
other, but all have trunks with spread-
ing branches or leaves, agreeing with
the conventional idea of a tree. The
bamboo, however, is a giant grass. It
forms a perfect sod of roots, in spring
everywhere sending up new shoots,
which come from the ground full sized
or sixty feet, when they send out their
delicate branches of thin green leaves.
Its chief claim to favor sets in its
varied utility, as seen in the products with
which the Japanese amaze foreigners.
