A-	Yes, sir, Capt. Thompson.

Q-51	You have signed a document?
A-	Yes, sir.
Q-52	Furporting to be an M.F.B. 1482 in which you state there
	were 4 other ranks and Capt. Thompson were the escorts.
	That statement is not correct, then, is it?
A-	They were split up separately at Moncton, sir, because
	the parties were going in different directions.
Q-53	Could you tell us how the 81 meals at 75¢ were arrived
	at?
A-	The 81 meals were for the escorting party.
Q-54	Which ones of the escorting party?
A-	The 2 N.C.O.s and the whole escorting party, sir.
Q-55	Well, for what period were those meals issued?
A-	From the 15th until we arrived at Halifax, sir.
Q-56	15th of when?
A-	15th of July, sir.
Q-57	So that meals were charged against this accused for the
	balance of the trip to the East Coast?
A-	Yes, sir.
Q-58	Although you say he was not present all the way through?
A-	No, sir.
Q-59	Who were the accused that were soing to the same
	destination as Pte, McKinnon?
A-	I haven't that information, sir. I handed all the
	documents over at the Court of Inquiry, the nominal roll
	of each of the escort and the accused.
Q-60	How many prisoners were going to the same place that you
	were taking Fte. McKinnon?
A-	I believe it was 5, sir. I am not sure on that,
