A SUCCESSFUL CONCERT.

A large crowd attend the Firemen and Foresters' band concert. A good programme of Music—A Small Boy Wins the Chair.

Over four hundred people attended the Firemen and Foresters' band concert in the Central school grounds Tuesday evening. The Firemen and Foresters have been working hard for this entertainment and their efforts were crowned with success. Long before the time for starting the programme large crowds were seen making their way to the school grounds, and after the band went up the gate-keepers had difficulty in selling tickets fast enough.

The band, under their efficient leader, Prof. Hulme, rendered a programme of music which was highly appreciated by the large crowd. The selection, "Marianne," was given in a manner which did credit to both leader and bandmen. Its rendition occupied about twenty minutes and the large crowd kept the beat of order from the beginning to the end. A set of waltzes was also highly appreciated. Mr. Herb. Chambers played a baritone solo which was enthusiastically applauded. The programme, as a whole, was well rendered and showed the good result of faithful practice. Mr. Munroe, of St. Thomas, favored the audience with a couple of selections on the bagpipes, and it was easy to pick out the Scotchmen in the crowd at that particular time.

About nine o'clock Mayor Mills went on the band stand and asked the couple who had signified their intention to be publicly married to come upon the platform. A dead silence ensued and all eyes were turned towards the stand to get a look at the couple. But they were not forthcoming and the crowd began to speculate as to whether the event would materialize. The Mayor made another call but still no response. The people were disappointed but not half so much as were the committee who had the concert in hand. They had made every arrangement for the marriage, and fully expected that the couple, who had accepted the terms offered, would not fail to put in appearance. The drawing for the handsome upholstered chair was next announced. A little girl was called upon the stand and she drew a ticket from the box into which they had all been placed and thoroughly shaken up. The number drawn was 854, the holder being a small boy named Charlie Core. The prize of five pounds of tea for the oldest couple on the grounds, was won by Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Coleman, sr. The concert was brought to a close about 10.15 by the band playing God Save the Queen.
