St. Mary's Chapel & Lectures. The second lecture of the above course was delivered in the School on Wednesday evening, the 6th inst., by the Rev. Canon Brigstocke, A. He dwelt also upon the remarkable differences of usage in which words have been employed in different periods of time, and showed how the history of nations might be gathered from the history of their language.

The Speaker also referred to the intimate relationship between language and morals, and concluded an excellent lecture with an appropriate quotation from the words of inspiration. On motion of F. E. Winslow, Esq., seconded by Dr. J. B. Benson, a vote of thanks was unanimously tendered to the lecturer.

It is expected that the next lecture of the course will be delivered by the Rev. Canon Medley, Rector of St. James, on Wednesday evening, the 19th inst.
