## Little Things That Count

How many articles does a family buy in a year without ever taking the trouble to ask where they are made? Most people ask that kind of question if they happen to be buying something that costs in the neighborhood of a hundred dollars. When it comes to the little things that cost from ten cents up to a dollar and a little more, they just buy them and don't take the trouble to look at the stamp or the trade-mark to find where the wages are paid for making them. It's the little things taken often enough that constitute the bulk of people's buying. The big things once got are got for most of a life-time. A piano lasts as long as a man; a sideboard lasts as long as a piano. A handkerchief is replaced by a new one in a few months. The piano and the sideboard may or may not be made in Canada, at any rate the buyer finds out because he invariably asks. When you have that settled and decide that it's worth your while to have them made in Canada, it might be a source of great satisfaction just to keep a chronicle of all you buy in six months and see how much that contributes to the grand total of keeping Canada's factories busy.
