Warsaw, Tuesday, Jan. 21.—(By The Associated Press)—Several thousand rifles, many machine guns and thousands of hand grenades, intended for use in an attempt to overturn the Plaudski Government, which has now been succeeded by the Paderewski Government, were discovered in Warsaw today. The Government authorities also arrested 1,000 Bolsheviki. The arrests were made in an effort to secure credry elections to the National Assembly.

There have been a few cases in which employers, caking advantage of the situation have offered ridiculously low wages. Through the co-operation of business firms, which is growing daily, the Government is meeting with considerable success in the placing of returned men. In order that they may give returned men work, many employers are dispensing with their foreign help.
