

Courses of Instruction.

Courses of Study for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts.

The subjects of the Undergraduate Course form a system of prescribed and elective study. The subjects of the first two years have been selected mainly for their disciplinary value, and with the exception that a choice is offered between Greek and French, are strictly prescribed. In the last two years the element of personal choice is more freely introduced, the prescribed studies occupying in the Junior year six of the fifteen hours of instruction each week, and in the Senior year four of the thirteen hours.

In addition to the regular class instruction, Honor courses have been arranged for the advantage of students who may be able to do more than the ordinary assignments of their classes. These are open to the election of any undergraduate of first-class standing. The value of the work performed in these studies will be determined by examination, and Honor Certificates of the first or second class will be given according to the results of these examinations.

Students cannot be admitted to the Honor courses if regular examinations are overdue. Any undergraduate, even though not having first-class standing, may, by vote of the Faculty, be permitted to give special attention to a particular study. Such student, and also one whose standing may have required his discontinuance of Honor studies, shall be entitled to a certificate of the work done.
