the other place, perhaps they would use that influence to get the bill to us as soon as possible. I know that many senators will be inconvenienced in making satisfactory travel arrangements for the holiday if we do not receive the bill soon.

I am anxious to accommodate all honourable senators. If we get the bill this afternoon we could consider it this evening, and if necessary tomorrow morning, and then refer it to a committee. In that way, we might dispose of it expeditiously.

Honourable senators, I propose that we now recess, to reassemble at the call of the bell not later than ten minutes to six.

The Senate adjourned during pleasure.

Upon resuming at 5.45 p.m.

Hon. Jean-Paul Deschatelets: Honourable senators, after consultation with Senator Brooks, the Government Leader has asked me to announce that the Senate will adjourn until tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock. We are informed that the other place will be sitting until 8 o'clock tonight to consider the Old Age Security Act. If the bill is ready for presentation in the Senate tomorrow afternoon, it is hoped that we can dispose of it some time during the day, so that the committee will be able to study it on Wednesday morning. The bill might come back for third reading at an early hour on Wednesday.

The Senate adjourned until tomorrow at 3 p.m.
