GALA DAY AT

FRANKFORT

**TO BE GALA DAY AT FRANK-
FORT**

Frankfort, Ky., Dec. 5.—The big-
gest crush of politicians ever seen
here is expected to be on hand
next Tuesday to witness the in-
auguration of **Edwin P. Morrow**
as governor of Kentucky. Mr. Morrow
will be the first Republican execu-
tive that Kentucky has had in many
years, and the party leaders are
planning to make his installation
in office a gala occasion. It is
expected that fully 25,000 strangers
will be in the little town to witness
the capital to participate in the festi-

vals. Republican clubs of Louis-
ville, Lexington and other cities
will be here in full force. The
entire city, public buildings, busi-
ness houses and residences will be
decorated.

The arrangements for the in-
auguration include a parade of polit-
ical clubs and a procession of car-
riages, in which the judicial and State
officials, State officials-elect, special
escort, committees and prominent
citizens will ride. The oath will
be administered to the new governor
by the chief justice on a high stand
erected directly in front of the
State capital.
