

St. Mary's (Jesuit) Coll., Montreal. M., 1st, 29 May, 1866, Dlle. Leopoldine Boivin, of St. Hyacinthe; 2nd 9 May, 1871, Dlle Virginie St. Denis of same city. Called to the Bar, L.C., 1867. One of the directors of the *Parti National*, Jan. 1872. Author of *L'Héroïsme* and *La Patrie*, two lectures (St. Hyacinthe, 1865) Was editor of *Le Courier de St. Hyacinthe* from 1862 to 1864, and for a few months in 1866. Apptd. Knight Grand Cross of the Order of Gregory the Great (Roman) 1888, and a Count of the Holy Roman Empire 1891. Sat in the Commons for Rouville from g.e. 1872 until g.e. 1874. Returned to Leg. Assem, Quebec, as Solicitor-General in the Joly Govt. to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Hon. P. Bachand, May, 1879, a position which he held until the resignation of the Govt. in Oct., 1879. Re-elected at g.e. 1881 by acclamation, and again at g.e. 1886 and 1890. On the resignation of the Taillon Administration 27 Jan., 1887, formed an Administration, in which he held the office of Attorney-General. Is now Commr. of Agriculture and Colonization. A Liberal.—*St James' Club, Montreal; Garrison Club, Quebec.*

MONFETTE, JOSEPH VICTOR. (*Nicolet.*)

B. at St. Pierre les Becquets, and received an elementary education there. M. Elmiro Tousignant. Is a farmer. Has been a Councillor, and Mayor of his municipality, and is a J.P. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. An Independent.—*St. Sophie de Lévrard.*

MORIN, JOSEPH. (*Charlevoix.*)

S. of Toussaint Morin and Calixte Vandal. B. at St. Paul's Bay, Nov., 1853. Ed. in local Academy. M., 1878, Georgina Simard. Is a general merchant, and has been Secretary of the Municipality and School Board since 1880. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1886, and re-elected by acclamation at last g.e. MURPHY, OWEN. (*Quebec West.*)

Descended from an old family in the Co. of Wexford. Father settled in Can. in the early part of the century. B. at Stoneham, P.Q., 9 Dec., 1829. Ed. by private tutor. M., 1857, Elizabeth, dau. of the late James Loughry. Is a Dir. of the Quebec Central Railway. Has been a Councillor; Mayor for three years of the City of Quebec; Presdt. for two years of the Quebec Board of
