CALDWELL, WILLIAM CLYDE, B. A. (*North Lanark.*)

B. at Lanark, May 1843. Ed. there, and graduated at Queen's University, Kingston, 1865. First returned to Parlt. in 1872. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1875; again returned at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Lanark, Ont.*

(ALVIN, DELISO DEXTER. (*Frontenac.*)

B. in the State of New York, at commencement of present century. M. Miss Wilkinson, of Kingston. A mem. of the extensive firm of Calvin & Co., Garden Island, lumber merchants, forwarders and shipowners. Has been Reeve of Garden Island and Warden of Frontenac. Sat in the Local Legislature of Ont. for present constituency from 1868 to 1874, when he retired. Was a mem. of the Canal Commission 1870. Again returned to Parlt. upon decease of sitting mem., Mr. Graham, Feb. 1877; re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Kingston, Ont.*
