

Sat. for the Upper Town of Quebec, in the L.C. Assembly from 1834 until 1836, when he resigned. Called to the Leg. Council of L.C., 1838, but did not take his seat, owing to the Union of U. and L. Can. shortly afterwards. Sat in the Leg. Council, Can., from June, 1841 to March, 1857, and was Speaker of that body from Nov., 1843 to May, 1847, and from March, 1848, (being at the same time, with slight interruption, a mem. of the Ex. Council) until Augt., 1853, when apptd. a Judge of the Superior Court, L.C. Transferred to Queen's Bench, Jan., 1855, where he remained until 11 Feb., 1873, when apptd. to present office. (*Salary \$10,000.*) Was one of the Commissioners for the codification of the Civil Law of L.C. from the commencement of that great work, 1859, until its successful termination, 1867. — "*Spencer Wood,*" *Quebec.*
