 make a Treaty of Peace with
 those in the American interest?
 or will the Satisfaction in which
 they are, on both sides, included,
 be a sufficient security for
 their acting in compliance
 with the Articles of Treaty
 stipulated?

Until His Honor
 can receive your opinion and
 judgment on these points,
 it will not be in his power
 to give any specific direction
 as to the arrangements to be
 made, but in the mean
 while I am directed to desire
 you will inform the Indians
 in Council, with the accu-
 -tomed formality, or rather
 with more than usual
 solemnity impress upon
 them
