My suggestion is that a Judge of one of our Federal Courts--either the Court of Exchequer or the Supreme Court of Canada--be, without delay, appointed Commissioner to enquire into <sup>into</sup> everything Mr. Hepburn has alleged against me, or at least such part thereof as you feel still remains uncovered by Judicial decision. The terms of the Commission and of the authority given the Commissioner cannot be too wide to ~~suit me.~~ <sup>meet with my approbation.</sup>

I am taking the liberty of enclosing the entire correspondence referred to above which I had with your predecessor in office.
