endeavour to conceive of any other method by which I can recombly must be accorded anything that approximates justice. I am sure certain you feel as I do that attacks of this character differ from all others, and in the case of a public man anyway, go to the root of everything that is worthwhile in life.

My suggestion is that a Judge of one of our Federal Courts-either the Court of Exchequeur or the Supreme Court of Canada-be, without delay, appointed Commissioner to enquire into everything Mr. Hepbum has alleged against me, or at least, such part thereof as you feel still remains uncovered by Judicial decision. The terms of the Commission and off the authority given the Commissioner cannot be too wide to sait me. The court of the commission are cannot be too
