Sir,-

With reference to the arrangement under which you have rendered medical attendance to Indians of Moncton and vicinity upon a salary basis, I beg to say that for sometime the Department has considered the advisability of discontinuing the existing arrangement, and consequently I have to inform you that payment of salary will not be made to you after the 31st of the present month. In explanation I may say that there are very few Indians in the vicinity of Moncton and, therefore, it is considered unnecessary to pay a salary for the medical work which is required to be done. In the event however of your being called upon to give medical services to Indians who reside in the district mentioned, or visit the Department is prepared to pay for your services upon presentation of your accounts.

I may add that the Department desires to take this opportunity of thanking you for the interest which you have shown in the welfare of the Indians.
