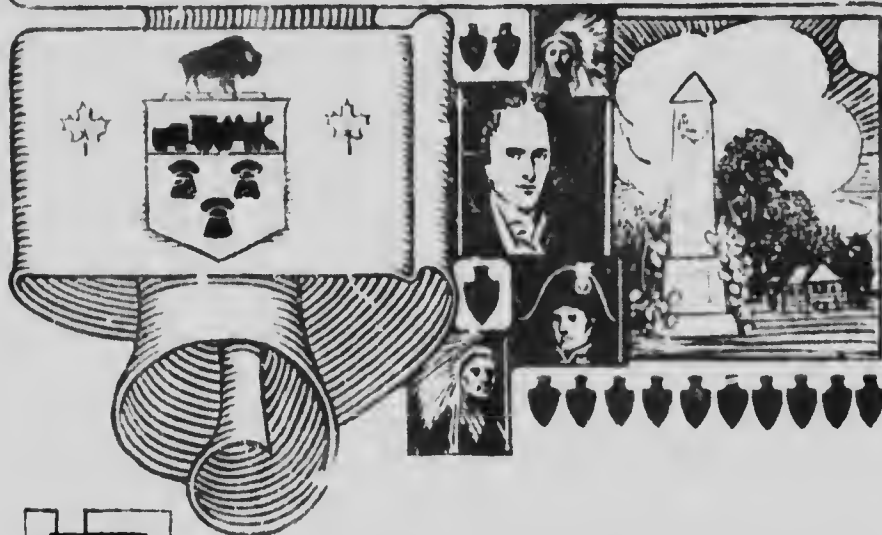


1812 RED RIVER 1912

THE CANADIAN INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION at Winnipeg, in the special features of this its 22nd annual year, is commemorating and expressing the national thanksgiving of the people on the occasion of the centennial of the first settlement of that unpeopled wilderness, which has since become the granary of America and one of the most remarkable members of the great sisterhood of nations that make up the British Empire.
