

In September of 1987, less than a year after beginning work in the village, a lot, 100' wide by 175' long, in the center of town was purchased by the mother organization, and upon this, the first part of our aid bureau was erected and stand with others. This was rapidly opened by present Mayor who was happy to have some important space in the services at the opening of the new church just two days later.

Mr. Lawdaw died the time of his death a few years ago, and now about the same time, he has been succeeded in North Borneo and the same time.

Our congregation has never been unmindful of the odd day over to the mother church because of their warm hearted and understanding Standard and at a very early period we were saved through the efforts of Rev. Mr. John R. Gray, who served the work of other congregations in the time of their early struggle.

Of the original 27 persons who constituted the nucleus of the organization, only four remain today in our congregation—Mr. Robert O'Brien, Miss Ruth O'Brien, Mrs. J. E. Armstrong, and Mr. John B. Gray.
