THE MARGONI STATION

NOW BEING ERECTED AT GLACE BAY IN NOVA SCOTIA.

Completion of Wireless Message System In Canada - The Station Will Be Ready In September Next

—The Commercial Use of the Great
Invention of Marconi Is Soon to Be An Accomplished Fact.


The date when commercial transaliantic wireless telegraphy will be placed at the disposal of the public is so close at hand that an interest in the stations by which this service is to be conducted is but natural.

Mr. Marconi, the inventor of what has proved to be the only successful wireless system, is now in Canada, and spending his entire time at the station which is being erected at Glace Bay, in Nova Scotia. The station which the Canadian Marconi Co. is erecting at that point is to supplant the station which was erected at Cape Breton. Cape Breton is but five miles distant from the present site of the great wireless terminal. ess terminal.

Mr. Marconi's work, of course, deals

Mr. Marconl's work of course, deals only with the installation of the sending and receiving apparatus, which will transmit the messages from that point to Poldhu, England. While he is busily engaged with his newly perfected apparatus a corps of construction engineers is at work preparing the exterior of the station, and getting it into perfect condition at the earliest possible moment. noment,
The illustration herewith shows the

The illustration herewith shows the station approximately as it will appear when completed. It is from a drawing prepared according to a detailed description, and until the time shall arrive when photographs can be taken



MARCONI WIRELESS STATION. of the completed station, it is the near est approach which can be had to an accurate view of the long distance installation.

It may be briefly described as comprising four towers erected to a height of two hundred and ten feet, and at four corners of a square of two hundred and ten feet on a side. Around this central area are erected three circles of poles concentric and varying in height from 180 to 140 feet. From the tops of these poles are stretched thousands of fine wires connecting all the poles and the towers, and so joined at several points that they form a great area of metal from which the electrical current is thrown into the air. Ether waves of sufficient strength can be sent forth from this surface to reach points at least four miles away, if the very carefully prepared data which the engineers command is of value. It may be briefly described as com

data which the engineers command is of value.

In connection with one of these highprovered long distance stations, it is not only necessary to be able to send forth a current which shall reach the other terminal station, but it must be able te go far enough so that when it reaches the other terminal there is still left sufficient current to be distinctly recorded by the receiving apparatus.

A duplicate of the station at Glace Bay will be erected at South Wellfleet, on Cape Cod, by the American Marconi Co., as soon as the Canadian station has proved its efficiency or shown that immaterial changes only are necessary in its construction. At the same time there will be srected at Poldhu a more powerful station than that which is now located there, and it will be a practical duplicate of the Canadian and American stations.

With these installations complete—and the Canadian and English installations out it to be finished before September of the present year—transatian tic communication by wireless telegraphy will be an assured fact. These stations will not only be able to do the work of sending messages across the

tic communication by wireless telegraphy will be an assured fact. These stations will not only be able to do the work of sending messages across the ocean, but they will also be of greater benefit to ships at sea than the stations which are now in active operation.

Practically all the steamship companies owning the great Atlantic liners have, by actual tests, become convinced of the value of the Marconi wireless telegraph system, with the absolutely certain results that they will have installed on board such high-powered apparatus as the Cunard vessels carry, and which is capable of receiving message, at points at least two thousand miles from the sending station. The canadian and English long-distance stations will be able to reach any single vessel, ne matter where it may be upon its course, as soon as the new apparatus is installed upon the vessels. This will do away with the necessity of relaying messages, and will keep all veasels constantly is touch with affairs on land, and place them in a position whereaby they may receive communications of whatsoever nature and whenever it may be desirable. The foregoing gives but the slightest idea of the great progress which the Marconi system is making, and which is daily taking a tangible form. The early future—If experiments already completed can be relied upon—will see more startling revelations than the great progress of the last few years has brought to light.
