Lemon Cheesecake.—Pare two lemons very thin, put the rind in soak in half a pint of cold water. Put in a nicely-tinned sauce-pan one pound of loaf-sugar, six ounces of fresh butter, six eggs, the yolks and whites a little beaten, and the water in which the rind has been soaked. Keep this mixture well stirred until it becomes about as thick as ordinary honey. Pour it into a jar, and it will keep good for several weeks. Line dishes or patty pans with nice puff-paste, and put in the cheesecake. It should not be browned in the oven, but should be made a nice, bright-eyed color.
