THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

y oven numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the West Territories, excepting 8 and 25, which has not been been ed, or reserved to provide sweed less for settlers, or fire eithers, may be homesteaded upon by any person who in the sete hear family, or any male over 15 years of aga, to the extent of on we section, of 160 acros, more or less.

ENTRY.

Betry must be made personally at the local land office for the first in which the hand is situate.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES,

emestead is require the amendmen with, under one titler who has been granted an entry for a h-provisions of the Deminion Lands Act and, to perform the conditions connected there lowing plans:—

(i) At least six months' residence upon and suitivation of the in each year during the term of three years.

(3) If the father (or mottier, if the father is decreased) of the home-steader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be entisted by such person re-siding with the father or mether.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second omestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisface by residence upon the first homestead, if he second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land wined by him in the vicinity of his homestend, the requirements of this ct as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, ownship or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (2) or (4) must cultivate 80 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those estitlers only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again threwn open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Bub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION, Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manit-base the Morth-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and amsistance in securing land to put there. Full information respecting the land timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoha, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitobs or the North-West Territories.
