ORDERED, That Mr. Berthelot have leave to bring in a Bill further to continue, for a limited time, An Act passed in the forty-third year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for the better " prefervation of his Majesty's Government, as by Law hap-

" pily established in this Province,"

He accordingly prefented the faid Bill to the Houfe, and the fame was received and read for the first time.

RESOLVED, That the faid Bill be read a lecond time on Saturday next.

Mr. Speaker then reported, that when the Houfe did attend his Honor the Prefitent this day, in the Legislative Council Chamber, his Honor was pleated to make a Speech to both Houfes of the Provincial Paritament; of which Mr. Speaker faid, he had, to prevent mistakes, obtained a copy, which he read to the Houfe, and is as followeth, Videlicet:

## Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and Gentlemen of the House of Alfembly,

The tranquil and happy flate of the Province, not having rendered an earlier meeting of the Legislature necessary, I have with a view of fuiting your private convenience, deferred 'till this time calling you tegether, being perfuaded that your usual zeal and attention to the public businels will enable you with facility to accomplish all those objects of Legislation which may be necessary, previous to your early feperation.

## Gentlemen of the Houfe of Alfembly,

I shall cause to be laid before you, statements of the Provincial Revenue of the Crown, and of the Expenditure for the last twelve months.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,
