Act of the Provincial Parliament. The petitioners, anxiously desiring-to carry the said Will into sull execution, humbly pray, that a law may be made, establishing the said House of Industry, as directed by the Will of the said John Conrad Marsteller, under such regulations and conditions, and in such manner, as to the Provincial Parliament, in their great wisdom, shall seem meet.

RESOLVED, that the said petition be referred to a Committee of five Members, to examine the matter thereof, and report the fame, as it shall appear to them, to the House.

Ordered, that Mr. McCord, Mr. Viger, Mr. J. L. Papineau, Mr. Du-rocher and Mr. Mure, do compose the said Committee.

ORDERED, that a certified copy of the last Will and Testament of the said late John Conrad Marsteiler, be laid before the said Committee.

An engroffed Bill for disabling Judges from being elected, or from fitting and voting in the House of Assembly, was read for the third time.

Mr. Mure moved to resolve, seconded by Mr Gugy;

That the said Bill be recommitted to a Committee of the whole House, on Tuesday next.

The House divided upon the Question.

Yeas 8 Nays 23

So it passed in the negative.

Upon motion of Mr. Taschereau, seconded by Mr. Louis Roi;

RESOLVED, that the Bill do pass, and that the title be, an Act for declaring Judges to be disabled, and disqualifying them from being elected or from fitting and voting in the House of Assembly.
