# **DEAN OF KINGS IS DEAD**

Christian IX. of Denmark, Born April 8, 1818, Crosses the Bar.

Death Came as a Great Shock to His Beloved Daughter, Queen Alexandra, to the Courts of Europe and to His People, to Whom He Was Beloved By Recison of His Democratic Manners-Frederick VIII. to Be Proclaimed King To-day.

Copenhagen, Jan. 30.—Christian the Minth, the aged King of Denmark, cean of the crowned heads of Europe. facher of King George of Greece, of Queen Alexandra of Great Britain and Ireand and of the Dowager Empress Marta Feodorovna of Russia, grandfather of King Haakon the Seventh of Norway and related by blood or by metriage to most of the European rulers, died with startling suddenness in the Amalienborg Palace yesterday afternoon. The accession of his succession, Prince Frederick, his eldest son, who will be known as Frederick the Eighth, will be proclaimed to-day. facher of King George of Greece,

The following official bulletin was issued last night.

"His Majesty died at 3.30 o'clock this afternoon. After his majesty had brought this morning's audience to a well and proceeded to luncheon as usual. Toward the end of the meal he gave evidence of indisposition and was compelled to retire to bed at 2.30 p.m. His majesty passed away peace fully, the symptoms indicating heart failure."

A Great Shock.

The death of King Christian has plunged half the courts of Europe into the deepest mourning and brought a sense of personal as well as of sincere grief to everyone throughout the king-dom of Depmark reaching even to the grief to everyone throughout the king-dom of Denmark, reaching even to the humblest cottage.

Every flag in the city is at ha.f-mast, all the places of amusement are closed and the people walk the streets as though they were passing through the chamber of death itself. Yesterday afternoon, when the flag

Yesterday afternoon, when the flag over the paiace was placed at half-mast, the news spread rapidly. It was not believed by the great crowds which gradually assembled in the square in front of Amalienborg Palace, but when uncertainty gave place to certainty those in the assemblage shed tears and dispersed in respectful, sil-ence. ence. World-Wide Condo'ence.

Telegrams and cablegrams of condo lence were pouring in last night in-cluding messages from all the sove-reigns of Europe and the Danish col-

Premier Christensen last night tendered his resignation of the Cabinet to the new king, who expressed a wish that the present Ministry should con-tinue to carry on the affairs of the Government. Both Houses of Parliament will as-

somble to-day, when the respective presidents will formally announce the death of King Christian.

At 3 p. m. the members will assemble in the hall of the Foikething to

receive the royal message announcing the accession of Frederick the Eighth. Public announcement of the death of King Christian and the accession of King Frederick will be made at noon from a baicony of the Amalienborg Great Shock to Queen Alexandra.

London, Jan. 30.—It is expected that a memorial service in honor of the late King Christian will be held in the chapel royal. St. James' Palace, simultanously with the funeral services held

in Denmark,

Queen Alexandra received the news
of the death of her father at Windsor. It came as a great shock to her, as apparently there had been no previous intension of any indisposition.

King Christian was one of the most unassuming of monarchs, democratic in his ways, and, in spite of some stormy periods, beloved by his subjects, who are perhaps the most socialistic people in Europe.

King Christian ascended the throne in troubled times, and lost through the greed of Germany the important province of Schleswig-Holstein, and for a vince of Schleswig-Holstein, and for a printed lest Germany time grave fears existed lest Germany might gobble up the whole of the little kingdom. When the Franco-German war broke out anxiety once more spread throughout Denmark because of spread throughout Denmark because of the renewed fear that Germany would seize Denmark to secure a safe and valuable sea base. Fortunately the danger passed, and of late years the only trouble has been the radical ten-dencies of the King's loyal subjects. Denmark has an area of 9.275.403 acres, and a population of 2.449.546. The kingdom includes Greenland, Ice-land and several important islands in the Balbic. The exports are practically all agricultural.
