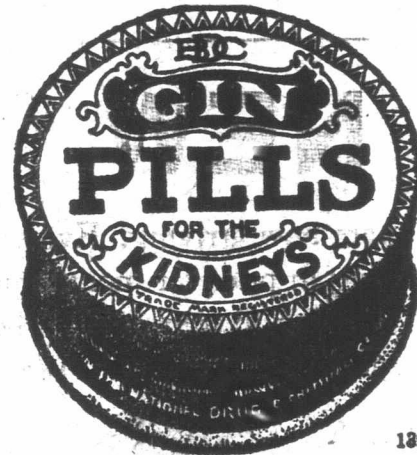
J. A. Burt has purchased the Sherman Lockhart farm and has taken possession. Mr. Lockhart has moved into a house owned by F. O. Weade.

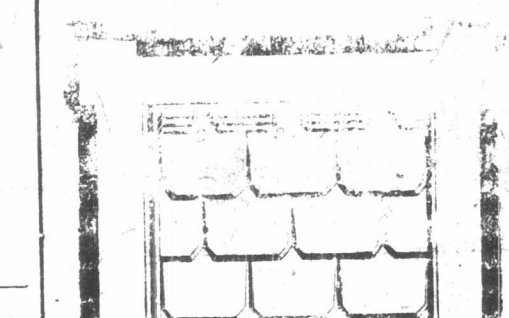
